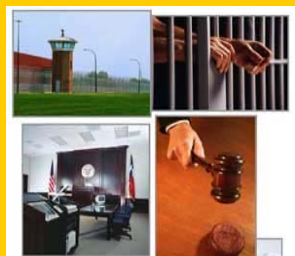
THE CRIMINAL JUSTICE PROGRAM

- Provides a strong foundation for successful graduate study in criminal justice, criminology, public administration, and other programs.

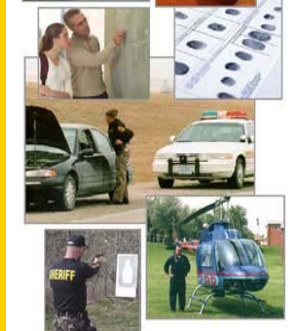

INTERNSHIPS

- ACC graduates who have completed required courses enter the College of St. Joseph as juniors with 60 credits remaining to earn the Bachelor of Science degree (see *Articulation of Transfer Credits* on reverse page). In addition to general education requirements, the criminal justice courses that transfer students typical require to earn the B.S. degree include:

 - Drugs and Society

 - Professional Writing
 - Internship/Field Experience

TUITION, FINANCIAL AID & SCHOLARSHIPS

- In addition to the individual benefits of higher education, attaining an advanced degree can significantly improve career opportunities and long-term income potential. Criminal justice graduates may pursue or advance careers in several professional areas:
 - Government
 - Law Enforcement
 - Corrections
 - Social Services
 - Legal Services
 - Federal Agencies

- The CSJ Financial Aid Office (802-776-5218) assists students in identifying and applying for financial aid (i.e., state and federal grant and loan programs, CSJ-based awards, employer programs, private institution/foundation awards). The 2008-09 full-time tuition is \$15,500 per year. Part-time tuition is \$250 per credit hour. Most students qualify for financial assistance during their attendance at CSJ.

- ACC graduates who transfer into the CSJ criminal justice program with at least a 2.8 grade point average and reside full-time on campus receive an annual scholarship of \$3,000. Full-time students with this GPA who commute to campus receive a \$2,000 scholarship. Students with at least a 3.75 grade point average and reside full-time on campus receive an annual scholarship of \$3,500. Full-time students with this GPA who commute to campus receive a \$2,000 scholarship. These and other available financial aid are renewable to recipients who maintain a minimum 2.75 GPA at CSJ.
